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Manuscript requirements: Please prepare/align your manuscript for final submission, using the following guidelines.

Format	Article files should be provided in Microsoft Word format. PDF as a sole file type is not accepted, a PDF must be accompanied by the source file.
Article Length	Articles should be between 3500 and 5000 words in length. This includes all text including references and appendices. Please allow maximum 280 words for each figure or table.
Article Title	A title of not more than ten words should be provided.
Author details	All contributing authors' names should be added to the paper, and their names arranged in the correct order for publication. Correct email addresses, mobile number & affiliation should be supplied for each author. Full name of each author must be present in the paper in the exact format they should appear for publication, including or excluding any middle names or initials as required.
Corresponding authors	Only one corresponding author needs to be mentioned with email and mobile who will respond on time to any queries raised by the publication secretariat/publisher.
Acknowledgement	Authors who wish to include this item should include in brief of not more than 100 words.
Research funding	Authors must declare all sources of external research funding in their article and a statement to this effect should appear in the Acknowledgements section. Authors should describe the role of the funder or financial sponsor in the entire research process, from study design to submission, if any.
Structured Abstract	Authors must write a structured abstract in maximum 300 words in total (including keywords in the submission containing the following inputs set out under 4-7 component sub-headings without mentioning the sub-heading. The abstract should be written in one paragraph. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Purpose (mandatory) 2. Design/methodology/approach (mandatory) 3. Findings (mandatory) 4. Research limitations/implications (if applicable) 5. Practical implications (if applicable) 6. Social implications (if applicable) 7. Originality/value (mandatory) Authors should avoid the use of personal pronouns within the structured abstract and body of the paper (e.g. "this paper investigates..." is correct; "I investigate..." is incorrect).
Keywords : Minimum number is 5 & maximum number is 10.	Authors should provide appropriate and short keywords in the abstract that encapsulate the principal topics of the paper (see the How to... ensure your article is highly downloaded guide for practical help and guidance on choosing search-engine friendly keywords). Whilst editors will endeavour to use submitted keywords in the published version, all keywords are subject to approval publisher's in house editorial team and may be replaced by a matching term to ensure consistency.
Article Classification	While submitting the authors must categorize their paper with the code in file name, e.g., 1_2_323_technical, or, 1_2_323_research, or, 1_2_323_viewpoint or, 1_2_323_conceptual or, 1_2_323_case study, or, 1_2_323_literature review , or, 1_2_323_general review. The category which most closely describes their paper should be selected from the list below.
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Headings	Headings must be concise, with a clear indication of the distinction between the hierarchy of headings. The preferred format is for first level headings to be presented in bold format and subsequent sub-headings to be presented in medium italics.
Notes/ Endnotes	Notes or Endnotes should be used only if absolutely necessary and must be identified in the text by consecutive numbers, enclosed in square brackets and listed at the end of the article.
Figures	<p>All Figures (charts, diagrams, line drawings, web pages/screenshots, and photographic images) should be submitted in electronic form, figure number with appropriate caption. If applicable, mentions sources.</p> <p>All Figures should be of high quality, legible and numbered consecutively with arabic numerals. Graphics may be supplied in colour to facilitate their appearance on the online database.</p> <p>Figures created in MS Word, MS PowerPoint, MS Excel, Illustrator should be supplied in their native formats. Electronic figures created in other applications should be copied from the origination software and pasted into a blank MS Word document or saved and imported into an MS Word document or alternatively create a .pdf file from the origination software and paste in proper location. Resolution of at least 300dpi and at least 10cm wide.</p> <p>Photographic images should be Pasted and of high quality.</p>
Tables	Tables should be typed and included in a separate file to the main body of the article. The position of each table should be clearly labelled in the body text of article with corresponding labels being clearly pated and also shown in the separate file. Ensure that any superscripts or asterisks are shown next to the relevant items and have corresponding explanations displayed as footnotes to the table, figure or plate.
References	References to other publications must be in Harvard style and carefully checked for completeness, accuracy and consistency. This is very important in an electronic environment because it enables your readers to exploit the Reference Linking facility on the database and link back to the works you have cited through CrossRef. You should cite publications in the text: (Ghosh, S.K., 2016) using the first named author's name or (Ghosh and Agamuthu, 2019) citing both names of two, or (Ghosh, S.K., et al. , 2016), when there are three or more authors. At the end of the paper a reference list in alphabetical order should be supplied.
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
