

## **Author's General Guidelines 10<sup>th</sup> IconSWM-CE as revised on 10.10.2020**

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**Abstract 250 words; by 30.10.2020 and Full paper by 20.11.2020 with word count with space : Minimum : 6000 & Maximum: 10,000 words.**

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**Review process :** Each paper is reviewed by the editor and, if it is judged suitable for this publication, it is then sent to at least two independent referees for blind peer review.

State of art with respect to the subject of review (This should be in-depth as well precise depending on the subject of discussion. It should cover latest references)</li><li>d. Discussion, analysis, results etc.</li><li>e. Conclusions</li><li>f. Scope for future research work &amp; acknowledgements, if any</li><li>g. References</li></ul>

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**Submission of Revised papers:** Will be intimated later

**Manuscript requirements:** Please prepare/align your manuscript for final submission, using the following guidelines.

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<b>Article Length</b>	Articles should be between 7,000 and 10,000 words in length. This includes all text including references and appendices. The abstract should be of 250 words in addition.
<b>Article Title</b>	A title of not more than ten words should be provided.
<b>Author details</b>	All contributing authors' names should be added to the paper, and their names arranged in the correct order for publication. Correct email addresses, mobile number & affiliation should be supplied for each author.

	Full name of each author must be present in the paper in the exact format they should appear for publication, including or excluding any middle names or initials as required.
<b>Corresponding authors</b>	Only one corresponding author needs to be mentioned with email and mobile who will respond on time to any queries raised by the publication secretariat/publisher.
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<b>Research funding</b>	Authors must declare all sources of external research funding in their article and a statement to this effect should appear in the Acknowledgements section. Authors should describe the role of the funder or financial sponsor in the entire research process, from study design to submission, if any.
<b>Structured Abstract</b>	<p>Authors must write a structured abstract in maximum 300 words in total (including keywords in the submission containing the following inputs set out under 4-7 component sub-headings without mentioning the sub-heading. The abstract should be written in one paragraph.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Purpose (mandatory)</li> <li>2. Design/methodology/approach (mandatory)</li> <li>3. Findings (mandatory)</li> <li>4. Research limitations/implications (if applicable)</li> <li>5. Practical implications (if applicable)</li> <li>6. Social implications (if applicable)</li> <li>7. Originality/value (mandatory)</li> </ol> <p>Authors should avoid the use of personal pronouns within the structured abstract and body of the paper (e.g. "this paper investigates..." is correct; "I investigate..." is incorrect).</p>
<b>Keywords : Minimum number is 5 &amp; maximum number is 10.</b>	Authors should provide appropriate and short keywords in the abstract that encapsulate the principal topics of the paper (see the How to... ensure your article is highly downloaded guide for practical help and guidance on choosing search-engine friendly keywords). Whilst editors will endeavor to use submitted keywords in the published version, all keywords are subject to approval publisher's in house editorial team and may be replaced by a matching term to ensure consistency.

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<b>Notes/ Endnotes</b>	Notes or Endnotes should be used only if absolutely necessary and must be identified in the text by consecutive numbers, enclosed in square brackets and listed at the end of the article.
